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## SIGN UP FOR COMMITTEES!!!!

With new Board Members come new Non-office positions and new committee members. Below are a list of positions that we need YOUR help with. Remember: IT TAKES EVERYONE HELPING IN THE CHAPTER TO MAKE THE CHAPTER SUCCESSFUL!

If you are holding one of these non-officer positions and you wish to keep that position, put your name down. If more than one person signs up, the Board will decide who will hold that position. There are also committees that go with these that you can be on too.

### Non-officer positions

**Research Coordinator**: Heads up the Research Committee. This is a group of members interested in research which can involve researching the history of known hunt sites, while working with the Hunt Committee, researching potential hunt sites or getting historical information for an investigation. They can call research meetings to get together at a library to work together on research. This is an extremely important position. There can NEVER be too many members on this committee.

**Investigations Coordinator**: Keeps a list of all members trained in Basics/Advanced and a list of Team Leaders. As investigation requests come in, this person contacts the client to schedule a preliminary interview. This is usually a short phone interview. The Investigation Coordinator also finds a Team Leader to run the investigation and finds trained investigators that are interested in participating. They also need to attempt to fairly distribute investigation opportunities between all trained members.

**Hunt Coordinator**: Maintains a calendar of planned hunts and those responsible for each month's after-meeting hunt. Keeps track of the status of each month to make sure a hunt gets taken care of and that there are no scheduling conflicts. Also heads up the Hunt Committee, a group of interested members who try to find hunt sites.

**Membership Coordinator**: Helps the Treasurer and Secretary keep track of the current list of active members and reminds people when their membership needs renewing.

**Newsletter Coordinator**: Responsible for putting together the chapter's monthly newsletter. Heads up the Newsletter Committee and recruits writers for columns or individual articles.

## Committees Cont....

**Webmaster**: Maintains the chapter website. Works with the PR Director to promote chapter events to the outside world. Works with the Board to post announcements. Heads the Web Page Committee.

**Chapter Historian**: Keeps a history of the chapter, in paper, electronic, or media form.

**Chapter Librarian**: Keeper of the chapter library of reference books. Maintains a public list of items which may be checked out, as well as a record of who has checked them out.

**Cemetery Relations Coordinator**: Heads the Cemetery Relations Committee. Contacts trustees of area cemeteries and works to get their goodwill.

There are committee's for all positions listed above. There is plenty of room for EVERYONE to sign up. Don't be shy about signing up and don't think you will be overwhelmed with volunteering. The Board is here to help you. We want you to succeed and will help you whenever you need it.
