## Guess That Haunted Location

1. This Victorian era mansion was located in the village of Borley, Essex, England. It was destroyed by fire in 1939 and was notably investigated by paranormal investigator Harry Price in 1937.
2. This is a former maximum security prison on an island in the San Francisco Bay. It is no longer used as a prison. Visitors and tour guides have made claims of hearing screams, slamming cell doors, and footsteps.
3. This plantation home located in St. Francisville, Louisiana is said to be America's most haunted bed and breakfast.
4. This is considered by some to be the most haunted college campus in the U.S.A. When drawing a line from each of the five cemeteries around the city, it forms a pentagram with the center being this University.
5. Located in San Jose, California this large home is supposedly haunted by the ghost of its eccentric female builder as well as many Native Americans who were killed with her late husband's line of rifles.
6. Located in the "Old Town" section of San Diego, California, this house was one of the region's first court houses as well as the area's hanging grounds before the house was built. The earliest documented ghost here is "Yankee Jim". James (aka Santiago) Robinson was convicted of attempted grand larceny in San Diego in 1852, and hanged on the gallows off the back of a wagon where the house now stands. This is often referred to as America's Most Haunted house.
7. This hotel located in Manhattan, New York City is said to be haunted by multiple ghosts; Dylan Thomas, Eugene O' Neill, Thomas Wolfe, and former Sex Pistols bassist Sid Vicious supposedly haunted the elevator.
8. This Scottish city's location is below the city and is renowned for its ghosts and ghost tours. Common ghosts include a little girl who has been reported to hold the hand of guests and is searching for her lost doll. Mediums reported her as having been murdered by another ghost who resides in the area, Mr. Boots, who has been described as a violent and callous man who shoves and abuses tour guests from behind. He is noted also for the heavy clumping of his boots.
9. The home of English and British royalty for 1,000 years, numerous ghosts are reported to have been seen here including Queen Elizabeth I. Her mother Anne Boleyn, is also said to haunt this castle and runs down the corridor screaming. Among those who claim to have seen the ghost, who sometimes is said to be carrying her head, are King George VI, William Ewart Gladstone, and Andrew, Duke of York.
10. This Registered Historic Landmark in Franklin, Tennessee has been open to the public since 1953 and serves as a memorial to the family who lived there, as well as the countless heroes of the Battle of Franklin. The modest brick home was commandeered to be used as the Federal Command Post while the family and two neighboring families, took refuge in the basement. The evidence of this battle remains with over 1,000 bullet holes remaining on site, which includes the farm office, known as the most bullet-damaged building that remains standing from the entire Civil War.
11. This lighthouse sits on the north end of Anastasia Island in Florida. The current tower, which was built in 1874, rises to 165 feet above sea level. The original lighthouse, built in 1824, was approximately 500 yards northeast of the current lighthouse. Due to the receding shoreline, it fell into the ocean back in 1880. According to the lighthouse's official website, there have been seven people who have died on the lighthouse grounds: three light keepers, a keeper's wife, and three young girls. Several of these are said to have died of natural causes. One man fell to his death from the original lighthouse in 1859, and three girls died in a tragic drowning accident.
